Artist: Pierre-Paul Prud'hon

Mark Top and Bottom

OR Left and Right,
whichever is longer.

Commit to those marks.

Mantra:

*"I will erase and change whatever
is necessary, including drastic
surgery, to keep my drawing
proportional and well placed on
the page."*

Envelope

Sketch a large simple
diamond around the figure.

Draw the longest, straightest
lines possible, to build a
container for the figure.

Stop. Look. Breathe.

Does the model look like
they will fit in your box?

Are the size, shape, and tilt
correct?

Midpoint

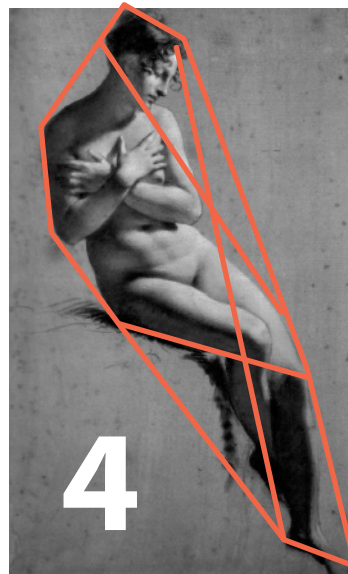
Use a skewer or knitting needle
to measure to find the midpoint.

Make a mental note of where the
midpoint falls on the model.

Commit to keeping the midpoint.

Stop. Look at the model. Look at
the page. Breathe, and imagine
the figure placed on your page.

Don't move forward until you can
visualize the model on the page.

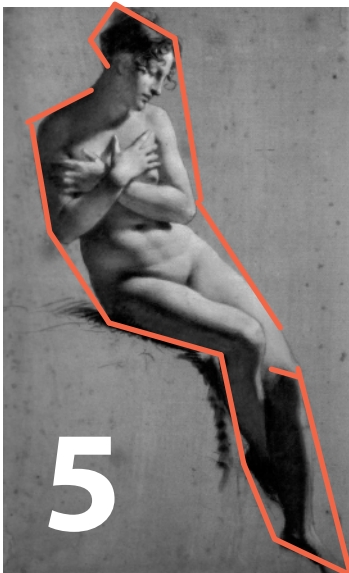

Web

Look for the longest,
straightest line that will
segment the Envelope.

Look from head to foot,
from distant points, to
create a "web" for the figure.

Segment

Segment the lines further.

Look for the longest,
straightest relationships
across the form.

Recheck the midpoint.

Stop. Look. Breathe.

Refine

Continue to segment lines.

Continue to look for
head-to-toe relationships.

Tips

Any time you feel lost,
confused, or unsure, put
down your pencil and just
Stop, Look, and Breathe.

Move your eyes quickly
back and forth from
drawing to subject.

The answers are in your
subject, not on your paper.
